Overview of the H-1B Electronic Registration Process: A Webinar for Attorneys and Representatives

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services invites attorneys and representatives to participate in a webinar on **Tuesday**, **Feb. 11**, from **2 to 3:30 p.m. Eastern**.

During this webinar, USCIS representatives will provide an instructional overview of the new H-1B electronic registration process in myUSCIS for attorneys and representatives. Another webinar specifically tailored for registrants will be held on Thursday, Feb. 6.

On Jan. 9, USCIS published a <u>Federal Register notice</u> to formally announce the implementation of the H-1B electronic registration process for fiscal year 2021 H-1B cap-subject petitions.

H-1B cap-subject petitioners, including those eligible for the advanced degree exemption, are required to first register prospective beneficiaries electronically with USCIS and pay the associated H-1B registration fee in order to enter the beneficiaries into the selection process for filing an H-1B cap-subject petition for FY 2021.

We are hosting this webinar to allow users to familiarize themselves with the new electronic registration process.
